From the Yeager Airport:

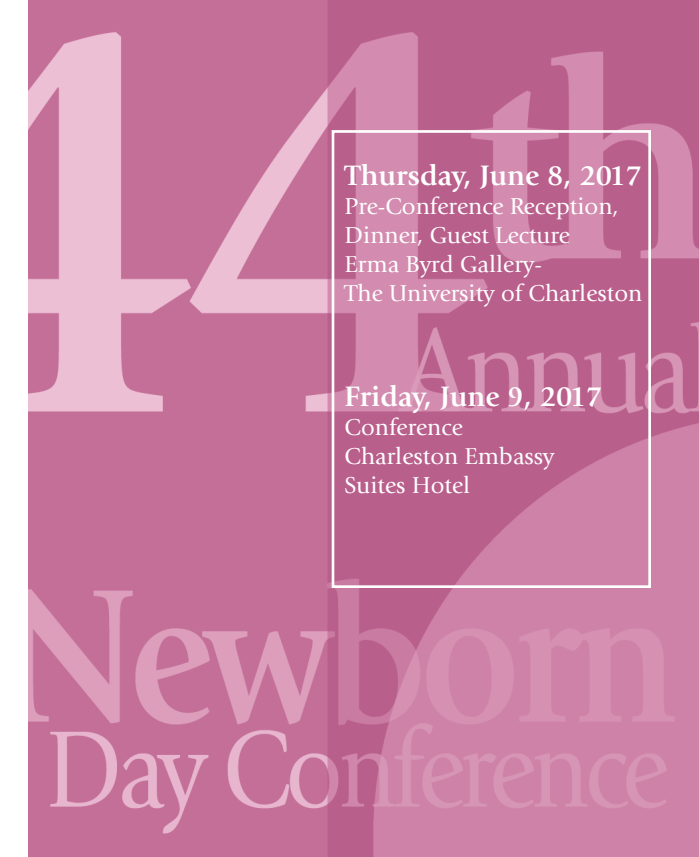

This annual seminar features lectures and panel discussions on a variety of neonatal and related issues.
