Program overview and objectives

This will be the 38th midwinter cardiovascular conference held at Snowshoe and will be co-provided by CAMC Health Education and Research Institute and WV ACC. The conference is designed to assist the physician caring for adult patients with complex cardiac problems and traditionally has dealt with the various difficult management problems that occur in patients with cardiovascular disease

In response to evaluation requests, more opportunities for case reports, discussion, and simultaneous debate sessions for nurses and physicians on Saturday afternoon, as well as a nursing and allied health breakout session on Sunday morning are part of this year's offerings This program is designed for cardiologists, internists, family practitioners, hospitalists, and emergency medicine practitioners, nurse practitioners and physician assistants, nurses and interested allied health professionals.
