Program overview and objectives

We would like to invite you to the 2019 West Virginia Trauma Symposium to be held at the Stonewall Resort, Roanoke, WV. This conference is designed for trauma surgeons, general surgeons, emergency room physicians, nurses, mid level providers and prehospital health care, coding specialists, pharmacists, and health information professionals. A registrar workshop will be presented as a separate meeting during the closing day of the conference. All registrars working in the trauma arena are encouraged to attend. This conference will represent a collaborative effort between experts in various trauma disciplines from around West Virginia. The speakers will present progressive and challenging issues in the field of trauma care. A poster session will also be held highlighting trauma research throughout the state.

The State Trauma Audit Review (STAR) meeting will be held on Saturday, September 21, 2019. All conference attendees are invited to attend.

- Explain active shooter protocol
- Review the treatment and care of the trauma pediatric patient
- Explain the use of ultrasound in trauma care
- Discuss and debate current research and trauma literature
