By attending this conference, participants should be able to

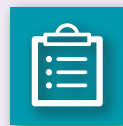
- Describe the unintentional consequences of cancer therapy

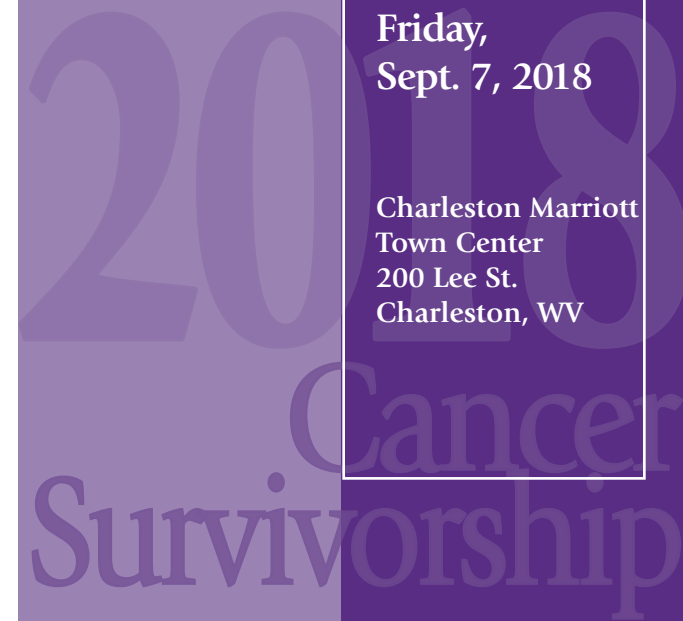

Parking is available in the medical center's visitor parking building. Parking fees are the responsibility of the course participant.

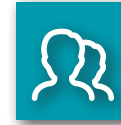
