Parking is available in the medical center's visitor parking building. Parking fees are the responsibility of the course participant.

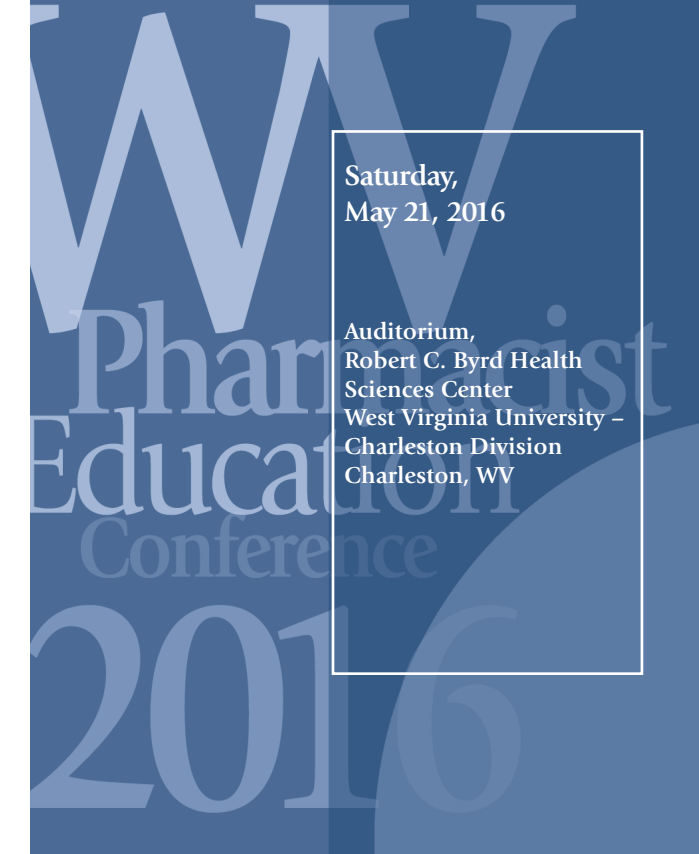
