Conference Overview and Objectives

We would like to invite you to the 2016 West Virginia Trauma Symposium to be held at the Stonewall Resort, Roanoke, WV. This conference is designed for trauma surgeons, general surgeons, emergency room physicians, nurses, mid-level providers, pre-hospital health care providers, coding specialists and health information professionals. A registrar workshop will be presented as a separate meeting during the closing day of the conference. All registrars working in the trauma arena are encouraged to attend. This conference will represent a collaborative effort between experts in various trauma disciplines from around the United States. A trauma nursing workshop will be held on the opening day of the conference featuring topics on surgical trauma, neurological trauma and complications. The speakers will present progressive and challenging issues in the field of trauma care. A poster session will also be held highlighting trauma research throughout the state. Committee meetings will begin Friday afternoon Feb. 12, 2016. The State Trauma Audit Review presentations will be held on Saturday, Feb. 13, 2016. All conference attendees are invited to attend.

At the conclusion of this program participants should be able to:

- Recognize maxillofacial injuries that require urgent treatment
- Differentiate natural and man-made disasters
- Discuss guidelines for pediatric triage
- Review state trauma systems and their role
- Review lessons learned from the OKC Bombing and Moore Tornadoes
- Review grade-based management of solid organ injuries
- Discuss the management of solid organ injury
- Differentiate between Crush Injury and Crush Syndrome
- Identify 2 complications that occur with Crush Syndrome
- Identify the interventions performed when treating Crush Syndrome.
- Define the degrees of severity of hypothermia
- List at least 3 benefits of hypothermia (accidental or induced)
- Discuss after-drop phenomenon and how to prevent it
- List three predisposing factors that can lead to hypothermia (accidental)
- List at least 3 indications for inducing hypothermia
- Define "oxygen free radical" and how it can inhibit healing
- Discuss the future of trauma care including the use of robotics and virtual systems

- Discuss the evaluation and management of the geriatric trauma patient
- Review end tidal carbon dioxide monitoring in the prehospital trauma patient
