Conference Overview and Objectives

We would like to invite you to the 2017 West Virginia Trauma Symposium to be held at the Stonewall Resort, Roanoke, WV. This conference is designed for trauma surgeons, general surgeons, emergency room physicians, nurses, mid level providers and prehospital health care, coding specialists, pharmacists and health information professionals. A registrar workshop will be presented as a separate meeting during the closing day of the conference. All registrars working in the trauma arena are encouraged to attend. This conference will represent a collaborative effort between experts in various trauma disciplines from around West Virginia. An eight hour Trauma Nursing Workshop will be held on the opening day of the conference featuring topics on surgical trauma, geriatric trauma and complications. The speakers will present progressive and challenging issues in the field of trauma care. A poster session will also be held highlighting trauma research throughout the state. The State Trauma Audit Review/ State Trauma Audit Committee meetings will begin Friday afternoon Feb. 17 and conclude on Saturday, Feb. 18, 2017. All conference attendees are invited to attend.

Objectives for 2017 Symposium

- Discuss impact of and the epidemics of trauma in the geriatric population.
- Assess and implement a focused assessment of the geriatric trauma patient.
- Understanding the principles of trauma triage in the mass casualty scenario as well as the isolated trauma patient.
- Identify and discuss the issues that are not identified during a night in the ICU.
- Identify and understand the pitfalls of communication within the trauma team.
- Discuss the perspective of trauma patients according to the medical examiner.
- Review current trauma literature and the impact on patient management.
- Review the classification and current management of the spinal cord injury.
- Discuss ways to survive an active shooter.
- Review and identify treatment and care of the burn patient prior to transfer to burn center.
- Identify and review the current treatments for orthopedic injuries.
- Determine and discuss what it takes to develop a trauma center.
- Discuss and review the pros and cons of TXA administration in the trauma patient.
- Understand the new trends for managing a traumatic brain injury patient.
- Review and discuss the management of concussion injuries.
- Define the leadership roles during a crisis event.
- Identify and discuss the treatment for the pediatric, geriatric and other special populations.
- Understanding what to do with the unusual or unexpected trauma patients. Being prepared to deal with whatever when you arrive the scene. Dealing with the unknown.
