About the Greenbrier

History: In the late 1700s, the sulphur springs were discovered as a medicinal miracle and as word of their healing powers spread, more and more travelers came to the area. These visitors began building a cottage community in the early 1800s and in 1858, The Grand Central Hotel, commonly known as the Old White Hotel, was added to provide additional guest rooms and a dining room. In 1910, the C & O Railway purchased the property, including the cottages and hotel, for \$150,000. That same year, construction began on the central portion of today's Greenbrier. During World War II, the property was sold to the US Army and became known as Ashford General Hospital. After the war, C&O repurchased the property and hired the renowned interior designer Dorothy Draper to completely redecorate The Greenbrier.
